Care for God's Creation

is the Church of England's Lent focus for 2020. With weekly themes shaped around the first Genesis account of creation, it explores the urgent need for humans to value and protect the abundance God has created. Here are three ways to participate, all drawing on the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2020 *Saying Yes to Life* by Ruth Valerio.

Lent course at St Anne's: on Thursdays at 7.30pm from the 27th February. Meeting at 12 Shamrock Road. (Apologies that this venue is not fully accessible)

Daily reflection and action: get a 'Care for Creation' booklet with actions for each day. £2 each or get the app.

Bishop Viv's talks: On Tuesdays in Lent, the Bishop of Bristol, Rt Revd Vivienne Faull, will offer a series of reflections at Bristol Cathedral on the climate crisis. The sessions will take place in the Chapter House at 6.30pm after Choral Evensong during March.

The post of Priest in Charge at St Agnes with oversight of St Anne's has been advertised and interviews will be on the 26th of March.

There will be an opportunity to meet the applicants on the 25th at 6.30pm with food, together at St Agnes Church. All are very welcome to come along.

2020 is Year of Cathedrals, Year of Pilgrimage

The Aust Pilgrimage Saturday 23rd May 2020

The pilgrimage commemorates St Augustine's journey to meet the Welsh bishops on the banks of the River Severn in 603. He intended to sort out differences between the Roman and Celtic Churches. This encounter did not lead to reconciliation, but it did pave the way for the Synod of Whitby, 61 years later, when agreement was reached.

Giant carnival puppets re-enact the story of Alban, Britain's first saint, the man after whom St Albans is named.
