*All gather outside the main door of the church.
When the Ministers arrive, this chant is sung:
Hosanna, hosanna, hosanna in excelsis!*

*The Celebrant introduces the service and
blesses the palms. The Ministers take their
branches.*

The Procession

Let us proceed in peace!

In the name of Christ. Amen!

*(Please follow the cross and keep as close
together as possible.)*

*Refrain: **All glory, laud and honour
to thee, Redeemer King,
To whom the lips of children
made sweet hosannas ring.***

**Thou art the king of Israel,
thou David's royal Son,
who in the Lord's name comest,
the King and blessed One. (refrain)**

**The company of angels
are praising thee on high,
and humankind and all things
created make reply. (refrain)**

**The people of the Hebrews
with palms before thee went;
our praise and prayer and anthems
before thee we present. (refrain)**

At the 1st Corner

*Jesus sends the disciples to collect the
donkey*

Reading: Luke 19.29-31

Reflection

We have a king who rides a donkey, (3x)
and his name is Jesus.
Jesus the King is coming (3x)
riding on a donkey.

At the 2nd corner

The disciples bring the donkey to Jesus

Reading **Luke 19.32-38** *Reflection*

People are waving palms and branches (3x)
for the King called Jesus.
Jesus the King is coming (3x)
riding on a donkey.

At the 3rd corner:

Jesus weeps over the city of Jerusalem

Reading: Luke 19.41-44 *Reflection*

We have a King who weeps for Zion (3x)
longing for her healing.
Refrain: **Jesus the King is coming (3x)**
riding on a donkey.

At the 4th corner:

Jesus goes into the Temple

Reading: Luke 19.45-46 *Reflection*

We have a King who cleans the Temple (3x)
casting out the dealers.
Jesus the King is coming

Outside the Church :

The leaders of the people plot against Jesus

Reading: Luke 19.47-48 *Reflection*

On entering the church, all sing:

Ride on, ride on in majesty!
Hark, all the tribes hosanna cry;
thy humble beast pursues his road
with palms and scattered garments strowed.

Ride on, ride on in majesty!
In lowly pomp ride on to die;
O Christ, thy triumphs now begin
o'er captive death and conquered sin.

Ride on, ride on in majesty!
The wingèd squadrons of the sky
look down with sad and wond'ring eyes
to see th'approaching sacrifice.

Ride on, ride on in majesty!
Thy last and fiercest strife is nigh;
The Father, on his sapphire throne,
awaits his own anointed Son.

Ride on, ride on in majesty!
In lowly pomp ride on to die;
bow thy meek head to mortal pain,
then take, O God, thy pow'r, and reign.

The Eucharist

The Collect for Palm Sunday:

Let us pray for a closer union with Christ, in his suffering and in his glory.

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Peace is shared:

...The peace of the Lord be always with you.
And also with you.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here. **God's Spirit is with us.**
Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.
Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour.
And now we give you thanks because, for our salvation, he was obedient even to death on the cross. The tree of shame was made the tree of glory, and, where life was lost, there life has been restored.
And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and singing:
Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest!
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

The bread and wine are consecrated in Jesus' words at the Last Supper:

.... Jesus Christ is Lord.

Lord, by your cross and resurrection
you have set us free.

You are the Saviour of the world.

The Prayer ends in anticipation of God's coming Kingdom.

..... for ever and ever. **Amen.**
